Morning Session – Mechanical Door Closers: Door closers don't just close a door, they control the opening through the entire swing cycle of the door! We will review door closer functions, discuss how to pick the appropriate closer, and demonstrate the options available to service a wide variety of applications. You will learn where door closers can be critical in ensuring an opening is code-compliant. You will meet and exceed your customers' needs by knowing the functional and durability requirements of their specific application. We will cover installation tips and adjustments. Afternoon Session - Fire Door Assembly: We will review the NFPA, IBC, and BOCA codes governing Fire Rated Assemblies. We will discuss the associated ADA and Life Safety codes that affect these same openings. We will cover the requirements and standards for Fire Door Assembly Inspections, how to prepare for inspections and some options for compiling your work. We will present the business case for including Fire Door Inspections as part of your services.

There are a lot of choices for electrically or electronically locking an opening. Each option has functional differences and there are code implications for some of these choices. The old standbys (electric strikes and mag locks) will always have a place, but the industry now offers a lot more choices! We will be presenting a non-brand specific review of the major types of product categories and review the code driven requirements that affect each of the categories.

An overview of how to create a description of operation for each choice will help to ensure that you and your customer are in agreement on the goals of the project. For some shops, this means the whole project is handled by that business. For others, this is a chance for partnering with access control integrators. We'll take a look at case studies of how some shops have made partnering a big part of their business

This instruction will help prevent unwanted cross keying. The seminar will also include information on various ways to create keying charts using the master key and the developed change keys, why floor plans with door identifications are necessary and how to create a master key system based upon customer requirements.

Upon completion of the class, the student should have the required information and understanding to accomplish almost any MASTER KEYING assignment On Thursday we will start the discussion of what is a good master key, what is a bad master key, and why locks are master keyed. We'll discuss the "planned destruction of security."You will develop beginning progressions, creating the Key Bitting Array, Order of Progression, and Compare to the Odometer. We will talk about Constants, including when to use them, when not to use them, step increment and progress change keys.

On Friday we will work on Advanced Progressions, including X masters, Y masters, Z masters, W masters, "Ghost" keys, Key Identification, and Rotating Constants. You will create a System, which may include integrating floor plans, door numbers, people who need keys, multiple level masters, standard master keying, rotating constants, and Maison master keying.
